IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR ALL CATHOLICS

1) Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by everyone 18 years and older, who has not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, enough to maintain strength, may be taken, according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but consuming liquids, including milk and juices, is allowed.

2) Abstinence is observed by everyone 14 years of age or older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or the ability to work is affected, the law does not apply. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays during Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence. If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, other suitable forms of self-denial are encouraged.

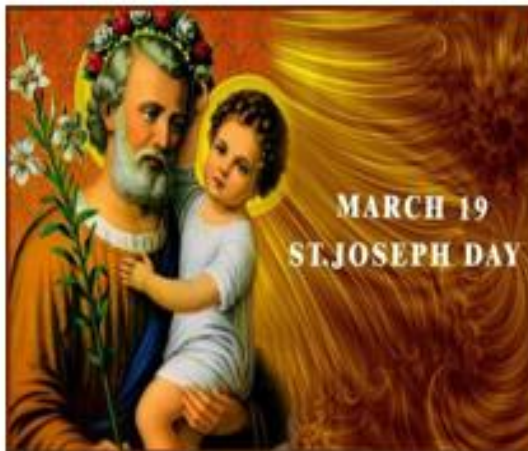

March is National Kidney Month
Kidney Cancer

Kidney Cancer is **not** one of the most common cancers such as prostate cancer, breast cancer, lung cancer, or colon cancer. And yet kidney cancer is not rare—overall it is the 9th or 10th most common cancer in the human body.

Kidney cancer is most often seen in people between the ages of 55 and 75, but can also occur in the young and the elderly. Sixty percent of the cases are in men and 40% in women.

What causes kidney cancer? Kidney cancer, like all cancers, can be inherited or environmental. Inherited means that certain mutated genes that cause kidney cancer are passed down from generation to generation.

Inherited cancers are also known as **familial** kidney cancers, because they run in families.

Only about 3-4% of kidney cancers are familial, while the rest are believed to be **sporadic**. Sporadic refers to cancers that develop in an unpredictable manner in patients with no family history of kidney cancer.

Environmental factors can increase the likelihood of developing kidney cancer. Studies from the United States and Europe have consistently shown obesity to put people at higher risk of developing kidney cancer. The typical high-fat and high-protein Western diet on which most Americans are raised may play a role in increasing the risk of kidney cancer, while a diet rich in fruits and vegetables may reduce this risk. High blood pressure and medications to lower pressure may also increase the risk of kidney cancer, but, like most of the factors mentioned here a direct link has not been established. **Radiation therapy** has also been implicated as a potential cause of kidney cancer in certain patients. Overall, the three most well-established, common risk factors for kidney cancer are tobacco use, hypertension, and obesity.
