

January 13: Saint Hilary of Poitiers, Bishop and Doctor—Optional Memorial

c. 315–367 Patron Saint of children academically behind, children learning to walk, mothers, and the sick Invoked against rheumatism and snakebites Pre-Congregation canonization Proclaimed a Doctor of the Church in 1851 by Pope Pius IX Liturgical Color: White

Born into a wealthy pagan family in Poitiers, France, Hilary enjoyed a fine education in the classics that

created in him a hunger for the truth. Though some philosophers pointed him in the right direction, they all fell short. When he stumbled upon the Scriptures, however, everything began to change.

Hilary was first struck by the mysterious name of God in the Old Testament: "I AM WHO I AM." God had revealed Who He is in a mysterious way. Then he discovered the Son in the Gospel of John 1:1– 14. Of this discovery, Hilary said, "My soul measured the mighty workings of God, wrought on the scale of His eternal omnipotence...by a boundless faith...that God was in the beginning with God, and that the Word became flesh and dwelt among us..." (*De Trinitate* 1.12).

Shortly after his discoveries of faith, Hilary was baptized a Christian and went on to defend the doctrine of the Trinity against the "insanity and ignorance of men." The faithful of Poitiers were so impressed by his knowledge and example that they chose him to be their bishop, a dignity to which he reluctantly agreed.

Among those who shared in the "insanity and ignorance" of that time were a group of bishops and laity who followed the heresy of Arianism, which denied the divinity of Christ. After Hilary was a bishop for only about five years, the emperor, an Arian himself, ordered every bishop to pledge their support for this heresy. When Hilary refused and vigorously defended the truth, he was exiled from his home country and sent to Phrygia, in Asia Minor. God used his exile in powerful ways.

While in Phrygia, Bishop Hilary occupied himself in studying and writing his greatest work, *De Trinitate* (*On the Trinity*), which provided a comprehensive defense of the doctrine of the Trinity as it was taught in the Nicene Creed. Bishop Hilary caused so much trouble for the Arians in Phrygia that the Arian bishops pleaded with the emperor to send him back home, which the emperor did.

Back in Poitiers, he continued to preach, write, attend councils, and even compose hymns. He was a true pastor who burned with a desire that everyone come to a deeper knowledge of the One God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Saint Hilary, your heart was restless, but you turned that restlessness into a diligent search for the Truth. Please pray for me, that I will also be diligent and resolute in my determination to find the truth. As I discover Truth and grow in faith, may I have the same zeal you had to share it with others. Saint Hilary, pray for me. Jesus, I trust in You

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

As Catholics, we fully participate in the Celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally shall have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession.

When we come forward to receive Jesus in the form of Body and Blood, we keep in mind Jesus really and fully present in the form of bread and in the form of wine. We really share His Body and Blood. Therefore, when we come to receive Him, it is a heavenly experience of welcoming Him to our heart, to body, and to life.

So, following is the ACT of receiving the BODY and BLOOD: BOW DOWN; say AMEN; RECEIVE the bread; CONSUME [**Do Not take the Blessed Body beyond the cup without consuming it.**]; make the SIGN of the CROSS. Move to the cup; BOW DOWN whether or not you are drinking the blood; consume the Blood if you choose; MAKE the SIGN of the CROSS and GO back to the seats.

All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another and are welcome to come forward to show reverence and adoration to Jesus. This can be done by coming forward, bowing down while crossing hands placed on the chest. At this point, a blessing is given by the priest. After the blessing, a person should move to the cup, bow down, and show reverence before going back to the seats.




