—Saint Carlo Acutis— (1991 — 2006) Canonized: April 27, 2025

Carlo Acutis was born on May 3, 1991, in London to a wealthy Italian family, and grew up in Milan. His precocious faith journey took off after he received First Communion at the young age of 7, and he regularly attended daily Mass, prayed the rosary and participated in eucharistic adoration. While he enjoyed regular pastimes for his age — hiking, video games, and joking around with friends – he also taught catechism in a local parish and did outreach to the homeless. Acutis used his computer savvy to create an online exhibit about more than 100 eucharistic miracles recognized by the church over many centuries, focused on the real presence of Christ that Catholics believe is in the consecrated bread and wine.

In October 2006, at age 15, he fell ill. Ten days later, he died of acute leukemia at a hospital in northern Italy. His body was later transferred to an Assisi cemetery as Acutis had asked, because of his devotion to the hometown of this medieval saint. One of Carlo's most significant contributions to the Church was the creation of both a portable exhibition and a related website cataloging Eucharistic miracles from around the world. He was able to catalogue 187 Eucharistic miracles during a period of two-and-a-half years. Through his expertise in computer programming, Carlo sought to share the profound reality of the Real Presence with others, inviting them to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. "The Eucharist is the highway to heaven," Carlo often said. "When we face the sun we get a tan...but when we stand before Jesus in the Eucharist we become saints." Carlo's legacy endures as a testament to the power of holiness in the digital age. His impact on the Church and the world continues to inspire countless individuals, particularly young people and computer programmers.

His road to sainthood — the canonization process — started more than 10 years ago at the initiative of a group of priests and friends, and formally took off shortly after Pope Francis began his papacy in 2013. Acutis was named "venerable" in 2018 after the church recognized his virtuous life, and his body was taken to a shrine in Assisi's Santuario della Spogliazione, a major site linked to St. Francis' life. He was then declared "blessed" in 2020 after the Vatican dicastery that studies sainthood processes recognized a miraculous healing through Acutis' intercession — a child in Brazil who recovered in a "scientifically inexplainable" manner. Last year, the church paved his way to sainthood by attributing to him a second miracle — the complete healing of a Costa Rican student in Italy from major head trauma in a bicycle accident after her mother prayed at Acutis' tomb.

His witness shows today's young people that true happiness is found by putting God first and serving him in our brothers, especially the least."—Pope Francis (Angelus address Oct. 11, 2020) Acutis' canonization Mass will be Sunday, April 27, at 10:30 a.m. in front of the Vatican's St. Peter Basilica, in conjunction with the celebration of the Holy Year's jubilee for teens. Saint Carlo Acutis is the first millennial saint in the history of the Church.


